

A motion was made by Colarusso and seconded by Zaboski to approve the reading of the Treasurer's report. Voice vote all in favor. Motion carried.

Dan Grescavage- Community Development:

Councilman Grescavage stated that it was one year ago since the Abraham's Creek channel and catch basin were inspected. A month or two from now, it will be inspected again. Last year it was the Army Corp of Engineers from Baltimore that did the inspection. This year it will be DEP and the Army Corp. Grescavage is asking residents not to place anything within 10 feet of the channel or catch basin and not to throw any trash in either one. Also, please keep all gates unlocked and dogs inside.

Recreation Board - New members are welcome to join the Recreation Board. Mr. Yarosavich bought a new pulley and Grescavage stated that the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers Local Lodge 1602 donated \$500.00 to the Memorial Day Parade. Grescavage thanked both Yarosavich and the Lodge for their donations.

Mike Dolan: Public Safety/Code Enforcement-

West Wyoming Emergency Services Monthly Chief's Report. West Wyoming Emergency Services responded to thirty-eight alarms in April: Mobile property (vehicle) fire, other 1- Forest, woods or wildland fire 3- Medical assist, assist EMS crew 1- EMS call, excluding vehicle accident with injury 20- Motor vehicle accident with injuries 1- Motor vehicle accident with no injuries 1 – Water & ice-related rescue, other 1 – Hazardous condition, other 1- Carbon monoxide incident 1- Power line down 4 – Lock-out 1 – Good intent call, other 1- Dispatched & cancelled en-route 1 – Wind storm, tornado/hurricane assessment 1.

Code Enforcement - We are continuing to work with Ken Shefler. Anyone who has any Code Enforcements issues or feels that any codes are not being compiled with can file a report with the front office staff.

As far as the Police Chief's report- two vehicles were switched to summertime tires- one vehicle received a new battery. Dolan stated that we did receive a quote for replacing the police department's door that was damaged. Dolan also stated that the Borough is having some issues with the new server, so please be patient when asking for reports.

An aggressive traffic patrol will be taking place this month and next month, so everyone should be aware to behave themselves. Traffic shifts that are monitoring driving is being paid for by the State.

In the absence of the Mayor, Dolan reported that there were 83 calls for the month of April. Three criminal arrests were made and 5 citations issued.

A motion was made by Dolan and seconded by Colarusso to approve Resolution 1 of 2019 to transfer property to West Wyoming Hose Co No. 1. The transfer will be 40 feet behind the current fire company crew quarters on Shoemaker Ave. This will allow them to expand, so that they can house their equipment. Voice vote all in favor. Motion Carried.

Maureen Zaboski: Administration/Finance, Health and Sanitation-

A motion was made by Zaboski and seconded by Grescavage to approve all outstanding bills approved by the finance committee. Voice vote all in favor. Motion carried.

Zaboski made a motion to approve the transfer of \$ 35,662 from FNCB General Account to FNCB Debt Service Account. The funds are used to pay for a loan that the borough has had for many years. Voice vote all in favor. Motion carried.

Motion made by Zaboski and seconded by Dolan to transfer \$11,426.66 from the PLGIT EIT account to FNCB General Account. Voice vote all in favor. Motion carried.

Motion made by Zaboski and seconded by Dolan to amend the payment amount to \$65,023.98 for the Police Pension Fund. Voice vote all in favor. Motion carried.

Mike Amato: Engineer

Routine Business. Working with the solicitor and the resolution to transfer some property over to the Hose Company. Also, checking for DPW what is our property and what is not, and what should be mowed, etc.

To follow up on what Mike said we are working together on the date of dedication for the property that is going to be deeded to West Wyoming Hose Co. #1. Otherwise, I am working with Council on our insurances making sure our coverage is complete. Routine issues have come up and have been addressed.

Citizens Participation:

Ron Pecukonis - W Sperling St.

I have a few questions. Recently my Dad's application for a handicap parking spot was denied. I am curious that even though the Chief of Police is supposed to make the determination about the application, then why is Council involved? I have talked to several people and you were talking to my brother and that saying that people are lazy and that is why they want parking in front. As far as snow removal, the Chief of Police was told to ticket them. Why did you two make the determination?

Councilman Stavish stated that he did not make that determination. Solicitor Lukesh stated that being the solicitor for the borough, she had to research the issue. In the Commonwealth of PA, handicap parking is normally limited to working with the police officer and the chief of police. As a safety issue, however, if it is on a 'No Parking' street, which your father does live on, and/or, if the resident has a drive way then the handicap parking sign cannot be issued. Solicitor Lukesh explained why she researched this.

Solicitor Lukesh stated that she will get information to Ryan and his father. The Chief of Police forwarded the information of the handicap application to me because he had not had that issue before in our town. It was a new issue. It is not an issue we deal with every day and that is why it was an issue that had to be researched.

Mr. Pecukonis asked why is there no parking on our street?

Council answered that Fire and EMS crews were having a hard time getting through with their vehicles. Other streets have been reviewed, also. We rely on the Chief and the crews to make us aware of the problems. They have the expertise. This is not a new issue. The issue on your street and others have been questioned since the 1990s. Other streets have been made 'No Parking' in the past because of such issues.

Ryan Pecukonis asked where was Mr. Herbert. Council replied that the mayor had personal obligations. Councilwoman Zaboski stated the mayor was indeed at the work session but could not make the meeting.

There was further discussion about the parking on W. Sperling Street.

Chairman Stavish asked for a motion to adjourn. A motion was made by Councilman Colarusso, seconded by Councilman Dolan. Voice vote all in favor. Motion carried.
