ORDINANCE NO. 2 - 2000

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING POLLUTION OCCASIONED BY OUTDOOR FIRES WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF WEST WYOMING, LUZERNE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF

The Council of the Borough of West Wyoming enacts and ordains:

Section I. No person or persons shall set or maintain any fire upon any of the streets, sidewalks, alleys, lawns, private property and/or public grounds in the Borough of West Wyoming, or burn or cause to be burned thereon any papers, boxes, rubbish, leaves or other materials or substances of any kind, nor shall any person or persons set or maintain a fire of any kind out-of-doors, anywhere within the confines of the said Borough, as now or hereafter, as the case may be, constituted.

Section II. Nothing contained in Section I. herein shall be construed to apply to the use of any standard commercially designed non-combustible equipment commonly used in so-called "cookouts" for non-commercial preparation of food to be consumed on the premises. No fire shall be closer than fifteen (15) feet from any building or from any property line.

Section III. Nothing contained in Section I, shall be construed to apply to the activities of the West Wyoming Fire Departments in controlling burning and/or any other Fire department activities that are conducted for the purposes of fire safety, including but not limited to containing and putting out fires in the Borough of West Wyoming.

Section IV. Any person who shall violate or fail to conform to any of the provisions of the Ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of Three hundred Dollars (\$300.00) and costs of prosecution.

Section V. Any Ordinance, parts of Ordinances, Resolutions, or parts of Resolutions, inconsistent with this Ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed.
